COPING WITH STRESS DURING THE COVID-19 OUTBREAK



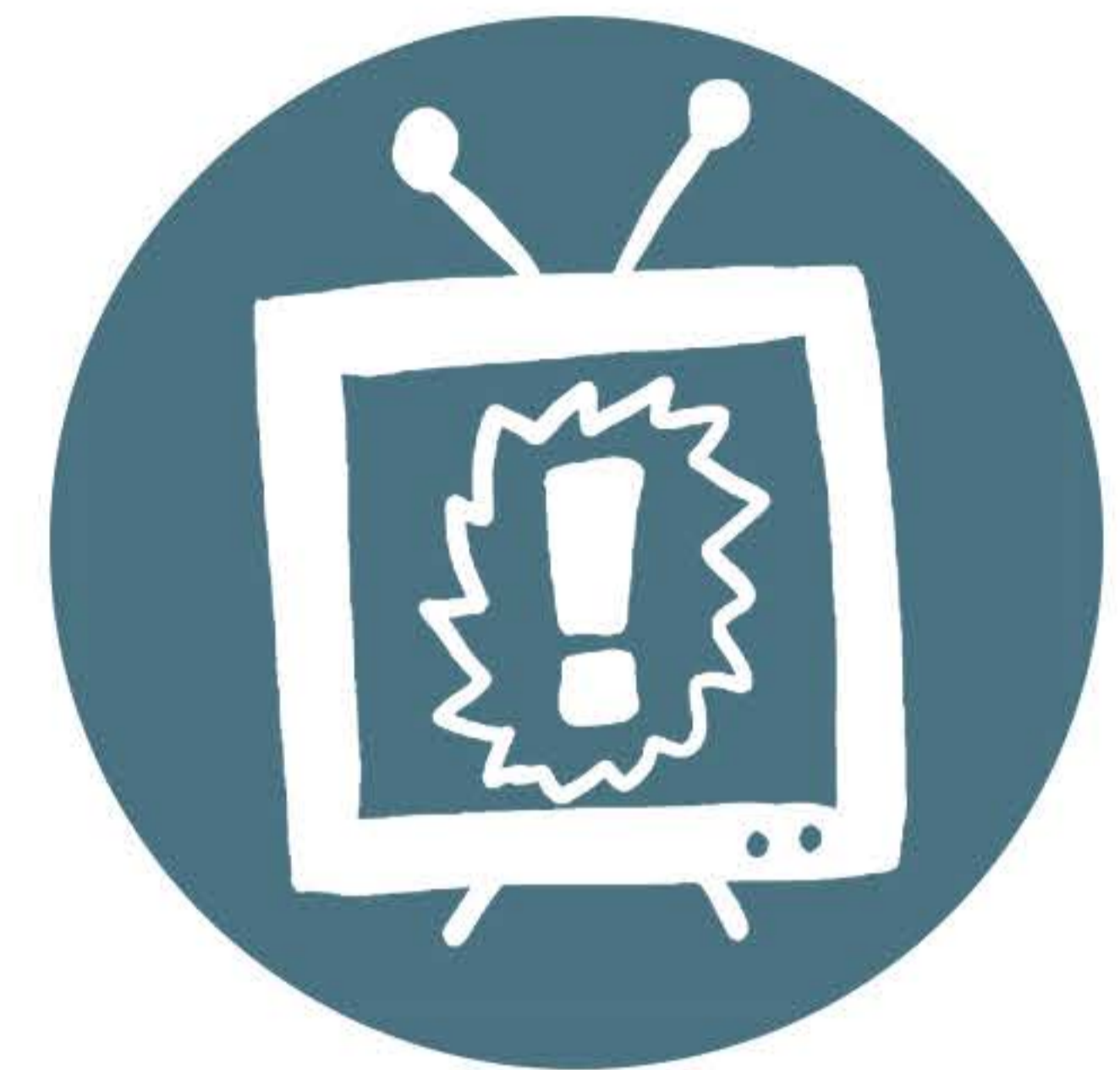
It is normal to feel sad, stressed, confused, scared or angry during a crisis.

Use trusted sources like WHO, RIVM and the Red Cross.



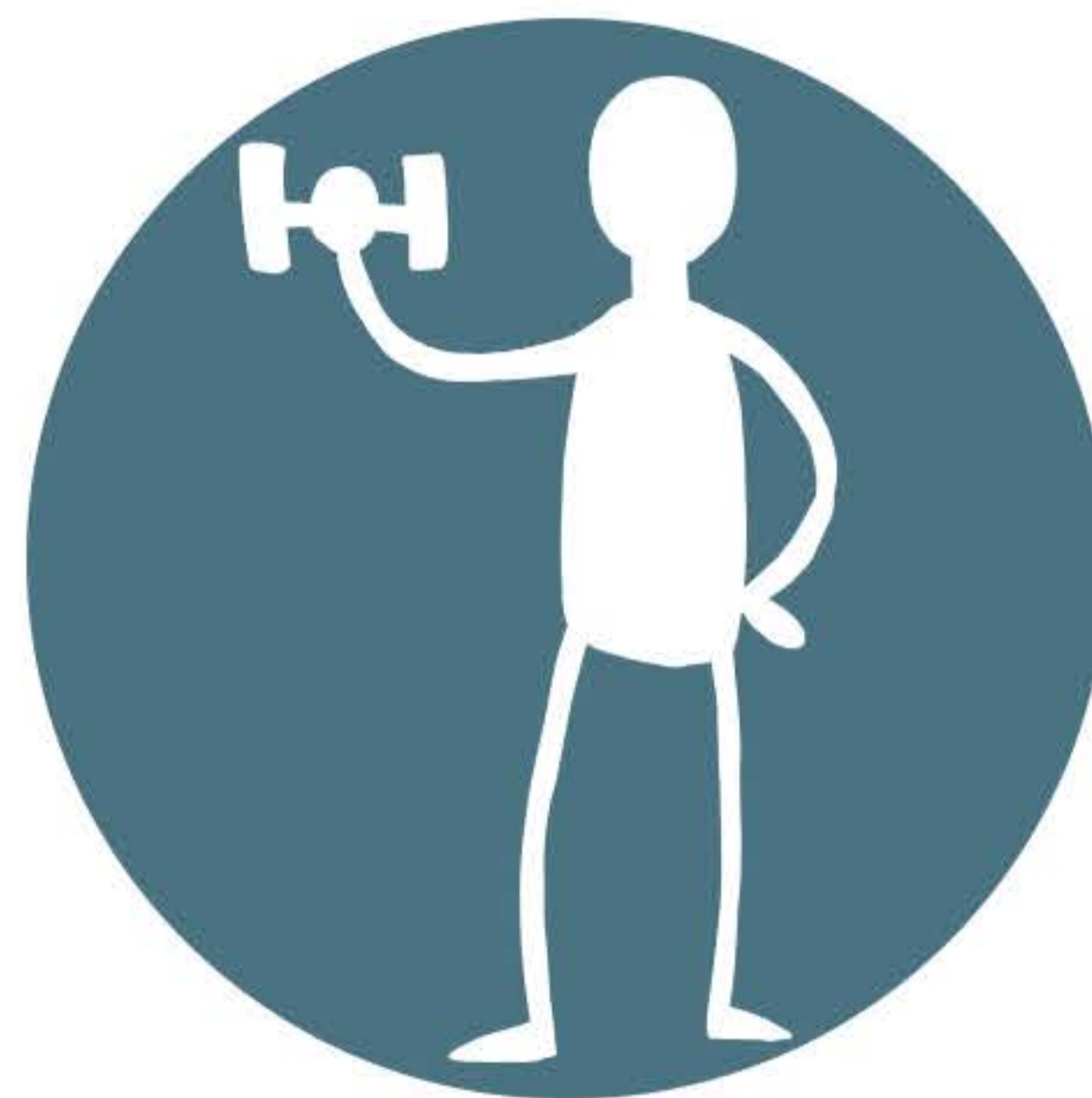
Limit worry and agitation by lessening the time you spend following media coverage that you perceive as upsetting.
